Kitchen Creations

NO PEEL APPLE CAKE WITH CARAMEL SAUCE

4 C. apples (do not peel) 2 eggs 2 C. sugar 1/2 C. oil 2 tsp. cinnamon C. chopped nuts, optional
C. flour
tsp. baking soda
3/4 tsp. salt
C. raisins, optional

Put apples in large bowl. Break eggs over apples. Add sugar, oil, cinnamon, nuts, and raisins. Add remaining ingredients. Bake in ungreased 9x13" pan at 350° for 55 minutes. Do not open while it's baking!

CARAMEL SAUCE:

1/2 C. brown sugar 1/2 C. sugar 1/3 C. flour 1/2 C. water

Boil 3 minutes, add 1/2 cup butter and 1 teaspoon vanilla. Serve warm over cake.
